We must continue to grow the Order every year; we have to step up and be proud that we are the only group that continues to grow year after year. We

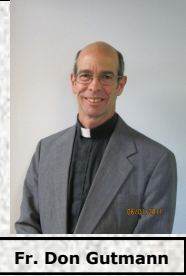

FROM THE DESK OF THE OREGON STATE CHAPLAIN

My Dear Brother Knights and Families

The Knights have earned a good reputation for being men of service to their Church. We are especially good doing charitable works, whether it's for the Special Olympics or the Fr. Taaffe homes or some other need within our community.

Another way we can be of service is in the ministry of evangelization. That's a scary word for a lot of Catholics but it doesn't have to be. I want to write about why this is an important ministry and how to take the "Fear Factor" out of it.

Pope John Paul II taught us that the most essential mission of the church is to evangelize. He called us to a "New Evangelism". Our own Archbishop Vlazny has also made this a key part of his leadership style within the diocese. Evangelism is the act of spreading the Gospel message, helping others to know about or come to a closer relationship with Christ. You don't need to stand on a street corner to evangelize, nor do you need to go up to a brother Knight and ask in a heavy southern drawl, "Brother, have you been saved?!" No, evangelism is just living our Catholic faith in such a way that others are drawn to want to experience the faith as well. It might involve an open invitation to a neighbor to join you and your family at Christmas Mass or at a KC sponsored dinner or social event. It might be having to explain why you decline a Sunday morning golf invitation so that you can go to Mass with your family. It might even be telling a coworker that is struggling with a personal issue that you'll pray for them. Evangelism is just sharing our faith with others, and it's always most effective when it's done in a nonjudgmental and a non-pushy way.

Keep Christ in Christmas Yr. 2011

The year 2011 was an interesting year! Even though we hear these are tough economic times, it seems that advertising has grown. Available billboard space was very limited for December - even as early as mid-summer. However we were able to acquire a total of 7 billboards throughout the state. Five of those were also available for our use in November, so the "exposure" of this important message was extended to over 60 days instead of 30 days as we often did in the past.

The major goal with this activity is to promote INVOLVEMENT. Four years ago, we had 16 councils for (21%) participation. Three years ago that had increased to 24 councils or 31% participation. Two years ago 18 councils contributed for a 23% involvement. This past year the numbers remained the same. In years past we have sponsored as many as 10-12 billboards across the state, although that was only in the month of December. My Brothers, let's strive for our increased involvement. Regardless of the total number of billboards we sponsor, together we can successfully achieve our goal.

**Remembering One
Who Served
Us All So Well**

Past State Deputy and Sir Knight Dennis James White, of St. Helens, died in Portland on Dec. 7, 2011 at the age of 69.

Dennis was born March 31, 1942 and raised in Green Bay, Wisconsin. He was the eldest of two children.

He graduated from Premontre Catholic High School in 1960 at Green Bay. After graduation, he enlisted in the U.S. Marine Corp and served on active duty until 1964.

Returning from active duty, Dennis married and had two children from that marriage. Then in 1978, he married his second wife, Patty, at St. Joseph Catholic Church in Green Bay. They also had two children from that marriage.

Dennis began working for Mobil Oil in Green Bay in 1973 as a truck driver. After 29 years and five job transfers, he retired as the Portland, Oregon terminal manager. During this time, he attended the University of New Hampshire, obtaining a bachelors degree in business administration, graduating summa cum laude.

Dennis was always a man of very strong faith and was a member of St. Frederic Catholic Church in St. Helens, where he served as president of the pastoral council. He was also a member of the Knights of Columbus and loved the Knights and all it did. He was a fourth degree Sir Knight and held many positions within his local council, Assembly and at the state level. He was eventually elected as the State Deputy of The Knights of Columbus for Oregon, serving in that position from 2007-2009. He was then asked to serve on the board of directors and advisory committee for Mount Angel Abbey and Seminary—where he continued to serve until his death.

Dennis loved life and enjoyed fishing, golfing, bowling, traveling, football as well as the love and joy his family provided him. In fact, at the hour of his death Dennis assured his family that the Packers would win the Super Bowl.

Dennis left his footprints in the lives of many. Many would agree that he had a million dollar smile. He will truly be missed.

Assembly In Action

Assembly 0906, Albany/Corvallis/Lebanon, has taken Supreme's request to help all Knights serve the need for more Military Chaplains. (As a reminder, Supreme has enacted a program to help supply military chaplains). This program is a joint effort between the State Council and the Fourth Degree. Supreme has asked the Fourth Degree Assemblies to lead this effort. Our support in making this program a success will be greatly appreciated.

The U.S. Military Archdiocese, which supplies Catholic chaplains to our military troops, estimated that it needs 800 Priests to fully serve all the Catholic men and women in uniform today. To help with this dire need, the Knights of Columbus has established a new scholarship program to help fund the education of seminarians who are preparing to become Catholic chaplains in the U.S. Armed Forces.

Fundraising for this Order-wide project will be led by the Fourth Degree Assemblies, The Knights will dedicate the scholarship money to the Archdiocese's "Co-sponsored Seminarian Program", which was initiated to recruit priestly vocations for the military, to benefit the armed forces as well as participating diocese and religious orders throughout the country.

INSURANCE CORNER

The grass is rarely greener

We all know the old adage, "the grass always seems greener on the other side of the fence." When it comes to replacing your existing Knights of Columbus life insurance with coverage offered by another company, the adage holds true. Perceptions are deceiving. A move to *the other side of the fence* might seem like a good one, but it can leave you with less *green* in your wallet – in some cases, a lot less. That's why it pays to remember another old saying, "Read the fine print."

There are many reasons to keep your existing coverage in force, whether that coverage is with Knights of Columbus or with another company. There are two major potential pitfalls of replacing coverage. Be sure that any agent trying to convince you that the grass actually is greener covers these key factors.

First, it's unlikely that you can obtain the same amount of coverage, for the same premium, that you were able to obtain with your existing contract. The two factors that determine how much you'll need to pay for life insurance coverage are age and health. Certainly, you're older now than you were when you took out your current coverage. There's no way around that one. And you have to ask yourself, has your health changed during that time? Is your blood pressure the same? Your cholesterol? Have you gained weight? All these factors affect the amount of coverage you'll get for your premium dollar.

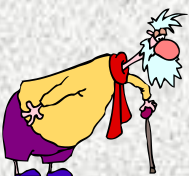
Second, all life insurance contracts contain a *contestability period*, which allows the insurer to contest claims made for a period (typically two years) after the contract is issued. Chances are this is no longer an issue with your current coverage.

If someone encourages you to replace – or worse, drop - your existing coverage with any insurer, please call me. I'll show you how your existing coverage is working for you and why replacement is rarely in your best interest.

All men are invited to join the Our Lady of the Lake Knights of Columbus Men's Retreat to be held at Mt. Angel Abbey Retreat House. The Director of the Retreat will be the former Parochial Vicar at Our Lady of the Lake, Fr. Sean Weeks. Fr. Weeks was ordained to the priesthood on May 29th 2004. He did his Theology studies at Mount Angel Seminary and received a Master of Arts Theology and then Master of Divinity. Before joining with the Archdiocese of Portland, Fr. Weeks was a Benedictine Monk for 8 years with St. Andrew's Abbey in Valyermo, Ca.

Fr. Weeks first assignment was to Our Lady of the Lake and after three years he was named pastor of Our Lady of the Mountain Catholic Church in Ashland Or. In Ashland he continues his work with law enforcement chaplaincy with Ashland Police Dept. Fr. Weeks is also the co-director and chaplain to the Higher Calling Camp for youth every August. In Ashland he has worked a good deal with the local sports teams, (unofficial chaplain to Ashland High school football team, and assistant coach for the AHS baseball team).

Fr. Sean will take as his theme for the Retreat, "Living Vocationally: Responding to the call of our God in our daily lives." The Retreat begins at 7:00 PM on Friday, February 24th and concludes at 1:00 PM on Sunday, February 26th. This year we are offering the opportunity to either stay at the Mt. Angel Retreat House, at a cost of \$200.00 per person, this includes a room, with bath; or for a cost of \$100.00 to commute to Mt Angel and either stay at home or make your own arrangement in the local area. Either alternative includes all presentations and meals listed on the schedule and the beautiful tranquility of Mt. Angel to inspire your reflections. One of the highlights of visiting Mt. Angel is the opportunity to participate with the Benedictine monks in their prayers throughout the day.
